

Phased Re-opening – City Policies and Approach

- All **BUSINESSES** must submit their Phase 2 compliance plan to Jan Brending
 - Staff will review compliance plans within a 24-hour period
 - Staff will outreach to solicit plans from businesses known to be operating
 - Enforcement of COVID-19 Phase 2 requirements will be handled as follows (notices will be provided in writing):
 - First notice: Educational (delivered in written form to manager/owner)
 - Second notice: Warning of notification to L&I
 - Third notice: Notification to L&I; cc Business
- All **CONSTRUCTION** projects must submit their Phase 2 compliance plan to Bill Hunsaker
 - Staff will review compliance plans within a 24-hour period
 - Staff will outreach to solicit plans from businesses known to be operating
 - Enforcement of COVID-19 Phase 2 requirements will be handled as follows (notices will be provided in writing):
 - First Notice: Educational (delivered in written form to manager/owner)
 - Second Notice: Warning of project suspension
 - Third Notice: Notification to L&I; Citation & Project Suspension

White Salmon-Bingen Police Department

- Continue to monitor overall compliance with Phase guidelines
 - Patrolling general city area
 - Monitoring public parks for gatherings of more than 5 people outside of one household
 - Playground/Group Gathering Areas remain roped off for Phase 2
 - Observance of business operations when visiting or in proximity of establishments
 - We are still honoring carryout only parking during Phase 2
 - Now allowed with distancing requirements:
 - Shooting Range
 - Open Trails
 - Bike Park
 - Indoor and outdoor worship services
 - Farmers Market – opens Tuesday June 16
 - Any observed violations will continue to follow enforcement protocol:
 - First Notice: Educate
 - Second Notice: Warn
 - Third Notice: Misdemeanor

City Operations

- City Hall will remain closed to visitors during Phase 2
 - Those needing to pickup permits or needing to drop off drawings will coordinate with staff
- Council and commission meetings will continue virtually with public comment via email
- All administration/business meetings should continue to be done virtually
- City Hall employees will still work from home
- The Housing Moratorium is still effective through July 15
 - Single-family home building permits are allowed to proceed in R-1, R-2, R-3
- Public Works
 - Full team back on duty but working in two or more groups as much as possible
 - Resume other tasks that had been suspended
- Public Restrooms
 - Closed through Phase 2 with plans to open Heritage Plaza (Information Center) in Phase 3 and to revisit park restrooms for Phase 3
