ORDINANCE NO. 2010-12-858

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WHITE SALMON, WASHINGTON REVISING THE UTILITY BUSINESS AND OCCUPATIONAL TAX ON WATER, WASTEWATER, AND REFUSE, AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 2007-12-808

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of White Salmon, Washington adopted Ordinance 2007-12-808 on December 19, 2007 allocating six percent of the proceeds of utilities operated by the city to the city street department for the benefit of city rights of way; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of White Salmon, Washington desires to make changes to the ordinance by adopting an ordinance that increases the business and occupational tax on certain city utilities; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of White Salmon do ordain as follows:

Section 1. White Salmon Ordinance No. 2007-12-808 is hereby repealed in its entirety.


Section 2. White Salmon Municipal Code 3.40 as follows is adopted.

3.40.010 Imposed. There is created a utility business and occupational tax in the amount of twelve percent per year chargeable monthly, commencing January 1, 2011, against and upon the total monthly revenues of the water and wastewater utilities, and a utility business and occupational tax in the amount of six percent per year chargeable monthly, commencing January 1, 2011 against and upon the total monthly revenues of the refuse utility of the city.

3.40.020 Collection; allocation of tax proceeds. Commencing January 1, 2011, there is levied a tax of twelve percent per year on the revenues of the water and wastewater funds of the city and a tax of six percent per year on the revenues of the refuse funds of the city, which tax shall be levied upon and collected from the monthly revenues of the water, wastewater, and refuse funds. Said tax shall be allocated as follows: six percent (one-half) of the total tax on the water and wastewater utilities shall be allocated to the street fund, and the remainder of the water and wastewater tax and all of the refuse tax shall be allocated for the benefit of the current expense fund of the city. The clerk treasurer is directed to collect the tax out of the monthly revenues received by the water, wastewater, and refuse funds, and is further directed to pay the moneys collected as set forth herein.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be effective five days after the date of first publication, as provided by law.


