

**CITY OF WHITE SALMON WASHINGTON
ORDINANCE NO. 2015-04-967**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING VEHICLE CODE SECTION WSMC CH 10.24
REGARDING STOPPING, STANDING AND PARKING AND PROVIDING FOR
SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE**

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of White Salmon wishes to maintain the safety and welfare of city residents by regulating the stopping, standing and parking of vehicles in the City; and

WHEREAS, the City finds that amendments are necessary to ensure adequate visibility in high traffic areas and to ensure the health and safety of City residents; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the City of White Salmon do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. WSMC Ch. 10.24 is hereby amended as follows:

10.24.090 - Parking two to six a.m./ Parking over 72 hours-Prohibited.

- A. Unless otherwise provided by ordinance it is unlawful to park any vehicle for a time longer than seventy-two hours on any street in the city of White Salmon with the exception of city-owned vehicles.
- B. There shall be absolutely no parking permitted between the hours of two a.m. and six a.m., seven days per week, Sundays and legal holidays excepted, between the streets commencing at the intersection of Jewett Avenue and Estes intersection north along Estes Avenue to its intersection with North Tohomish Street. And from Estes and Jewett West to Main on the North and South side of the Roadway.
- C. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be deemed to have committed a traffic infraction and shall be penalized in an amount of not less than fifteen dollars and not more than fifty dollars.

10.24.100 - Parking from two a.m. to six a.m. / Parking over 72 hours —Penalty—
Impoundment.

- A. Within the streets described in Section 10.24.090, which prohibits parking from two a.m. to six a.m. and parking over seventy-two hours as hereinabove set forth, for the period October 1st through March 31st, in addition to the fines imposed by this section, in the event any vehicle is parked within the prohibited streets between the hours of two a.m. and six a.m., the city shall have the right to tow such vehicle away from said streets during such hours, and

shall impound the vehicle in a garage, in its discretion, and the owner or registered owner of the vehicle shall be required to pay the imposed towing charge imposed by the garage, together with the fine thereon imposed for a violation of this section and Section 10.24.090, prior to release of the vehicle by the garage owner; and the owner or registered owner of the vehicle shall procure from the municipal court a receipt showing such fine has been paid and present the same to the garage custodian of the vehicle prior to the release of the vehicle unto the owner or registered owner thereof.

- B. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be deemed to have committed a traffic infraction and shall be penalized in an amount of not less than fifteen dollars and not more than fifty dollars.

10.24.110 - Logging trucks-Overnight parking prohibited.

No overnight parking of loaded logging trucks shall be permitted on any city street within the corporate limits of the city.

10.24.120 - Parking prohibited.

There shall be no parking permitted whatsoever, of any vehicle of any nature, kind or description, on the following streets, set forth as follows:

- A. On NW Manley, no parking on the driving surface.
- B. On NW Patton, no parking on pavement.
- C. On East and West side of NW Riverview Dr, no parking on pavement.
- D. On west side of 5th Avenue.
- E. On NE Vine, no parking on pavement.
- F. On NW Cherry Street, no parking North side of road.
- G. On NW Spring, no parking in South side of road.
- H. On the North side of Jewett Blvd between Wauna and Grandview.
- I. On the north side of NE Washington between NE Estes and NE Church, no parking on pavement.
- J. Parking along the west side of NE Church from NE Tohomish to the Alley along the Fire Hall is for city-owned vehicle parking only, all other vehicle parking is prohibited.


SECTION 2: EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall become effective five days after publication as provided by law.


SECTION 3: SEVERABILITY

If any part of this ordinance is declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid for any reason, the remaining provisions shall be construed to be effective after removing the objectionable provision(s).


