What is a Shoreline Master Program (SMP)?


- An SMP is a set of policies and regulations required by state law that has three basic principles:
 - Protect the environmental resources of state shorelines
 - Promote public access and enjoyment opportunities
 - Give priority to uses that require a shoreline location

Still must:

- Protect Critical Areas
- Ensure No Net Loss of Ecological Functions
- Encourage preferred uses


Where does an SMP apply?

- Applies to "Shorelines of the State," which are waterbodies that meet certain criteria
 - Waters
 - Streams & rivers with mean annual flow of 20 cfs or greater (Columbia River)
 - Lakes 20 acres or larger
 - Shorelands- On-the-ground validation on permit-by-permit basis
 - Upland areas 200 feet from OHWM
 - Associated wetlands (within 100-year floodplain or with hydrologic connection)
 - FEMA floodway and up to 200 feet landward of the floodway when within the 100 year floodplain.



What is an SMP periodic update?

- 1. The state requires all SMPs to be reviewed every eight years
 - The City's current SMP was adopted in 2017
- 2. Periodic review is intended to keep SMPs current with:
 - Amendments to state law (WAC, RCW)
 - Changes in local plans and regulations
 - New or improved data and information




The SMP periodic update will not:

- 1. Re-evaluate the ecological baseline which was established as part of the comprehensive update
- 2. Extensively assess no net loss criteria other than to ensure that proposed amendments do not result in degradation of the baseline condition

Takeaways

- This is not a major update of the SMP
- Main goal is to ensure consistency with existing rules
- Joint process with Department of Ecology



SMP

Consistency with:

- 1. State legislative amendments
- 2. Critical areas regulations
 - Ecology July 2018 wetland buffer guidance
 - WDNR, WDFW, and State Guidance
- 3. Comprehensive Plan & municipal code (development regulations)



Legislative Amendments

- 1. Exemptions from Substantial Development Permits
 - Remove specific exemption language and rely solely on WAC 173-27-040
- 2. Exceptions
 - Add statutory exceptions section
- 3. Shoreline Restoration Relief
 - Setback reduction option for associated development

Critical Areas Regulations in Shoreline Jurisdiction

- 1. Ensure critical areas tract measures remain in-effect.
- Review existing wetland buffer requirements consistent with the 2018 guidance from the Washington State Department of Ecology
 - A. Reference up-to-date 2014 wetland rating system & minimization measures
 - B. Habitat corridor requirements

Critical Areas Regulations in Shoreline Jurisdiction

- 1. Re-locate Heritage Tree section to zoning code.
- 2. Add WDNR references seismic hazard area guidance
- 3. Clarify buffer averaging requirements

Anticipated Timeline of Key Events


- City Planning Commission Meeting February 22nd, 2023

- Joint Ecology\City public hearing April 12th, 2023
- Respond to Public Comments April 2023
- Submittal to Ecology for Initial Determination May 2023
- Local adoption of the SMP June 2023
